Building Management: TimeTrack users is doing work related to custodial and maintenance in the school.	<ul> <li>consults with maintenance or custodial staff</li> <li>consults with contractors</li> </ul>
Decision Making Groups and Committees: TimeTrack user participates with formal or informal decision-making groups about anything that is not curriculum, instruction, or assessment.	<ul> <li>meeting with teacher advisory group about the lunch schedule</li> <li>informal focus group to discuss the dress policy</li> <li>meeting to plan car wash</li> <li>festival planning</li> </ul>
District: Meetings, Supervisor, Others: TimeTrack user spends time with supervisors and others at a district level about management, non-CIA issues.	<ul> <li>work with district on vandalism</li> <li>budget</li> <li>safety planning</li> </ul>

Employee Discipline: TimeTrack user gives an oral or written warning or takes other punitive action.	<ul> <li>oral warning</li> <li>written warning</li> <li>improvement plan</li> <li>termination</li> </ul>

Office Work/Prep: TimeTrack user is individually doing any work in or out of the office <i>not</i> tied to instruction or assessment that is preparatory in nature.	<ul> <li>TimeTrack user is reviewing/completing payroll, field trip forms, etc.</li> <li>TimeTrack user is preparing the budget.</li> <li>TimeTrack user is reading student referrals.</li> </ul>
Parents/Guardians: Any interaction the TimeTrack user has with parents or guardians devoid of CIA.	<ul> <li>talk with a parent about a bus issue</li> <li>works with parents on a playground project</li> </ul>
Professional Development: TimeTrack user either presents professional development or participates in a professional development training session managerial in nature.	<ul> <li>presentation on fire drill or lock down procedures</li> <li>Attending or presenting a training session on new tech platform</li> </ul>
Student Discipline: TimeTrack user engages students about behavior problems or transgressions – includes consequences.	<ul> <li>student discipline referrals</li> <li>consequence for misbehavior</li> <li>correcting student behavior and applying/ implying a consequence</li> </ul>

**Student Supervision**: TimeTrack user gives direction concerning a non-instructional issue – also includes conversations with staff about non-school issues.

- monitoring hallway transitions, recess, student arrival and dismissal
- cafeteria duty
- Work w/student about his/her behavior without a consequence
